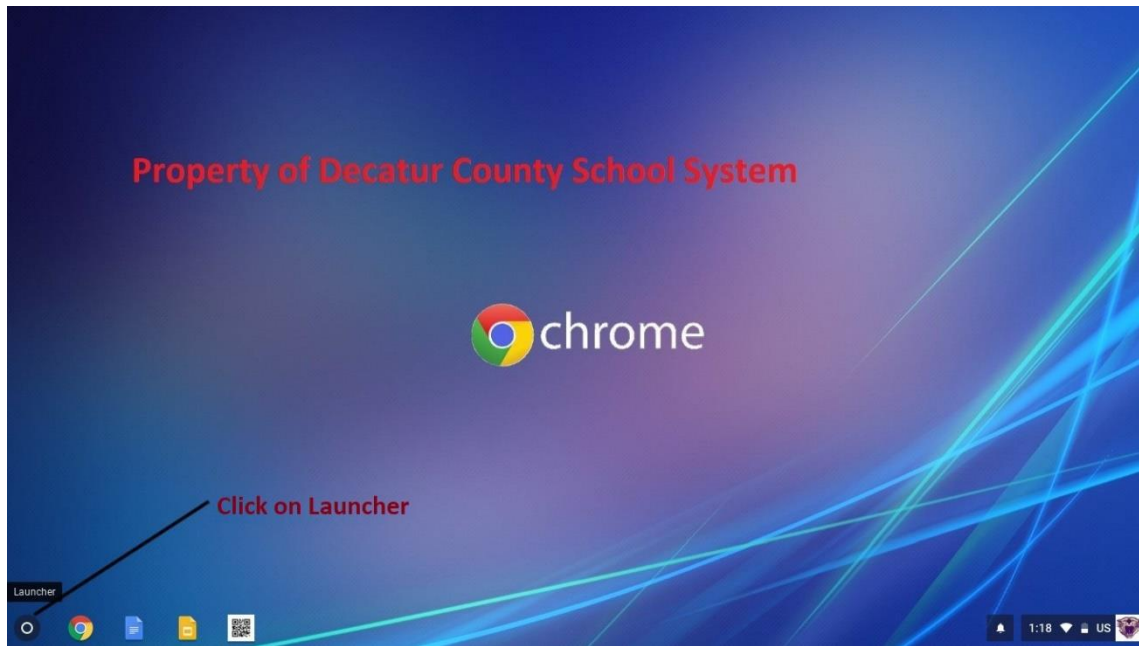
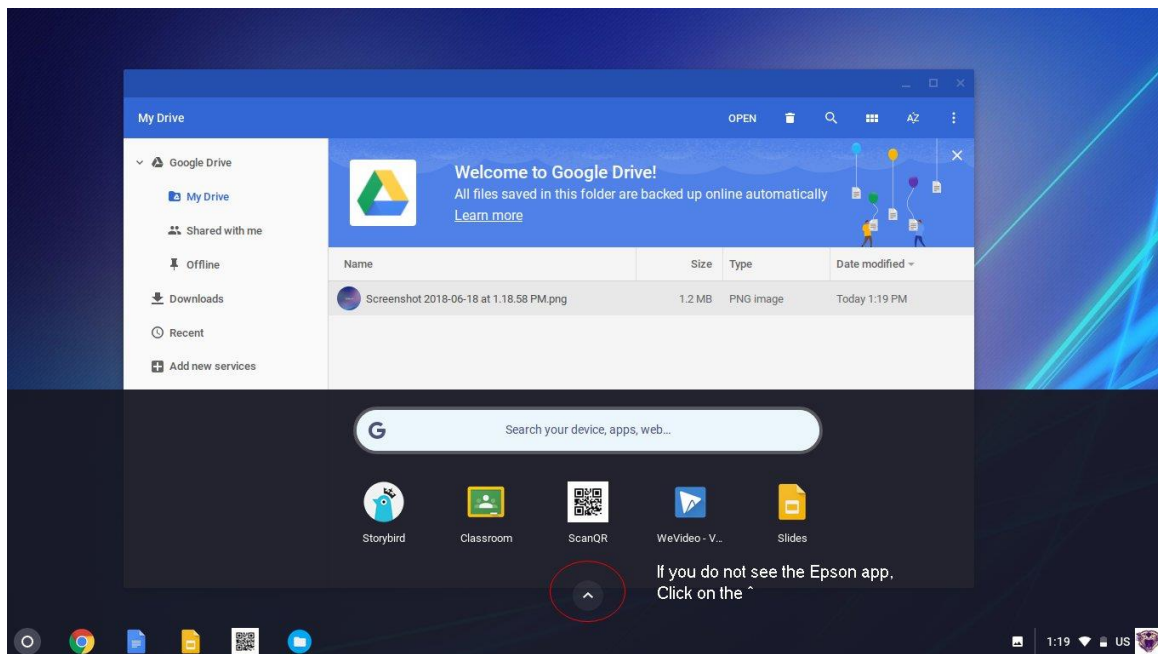


1. Click on Launcher – Lower Left Corner of Screen




2. If you do not see the Epson IProjection icon  Click on the ^





3. Click the Epson iProjection  icon.

**Search projector**  

Enter the IP address for the projector, and then click Search.

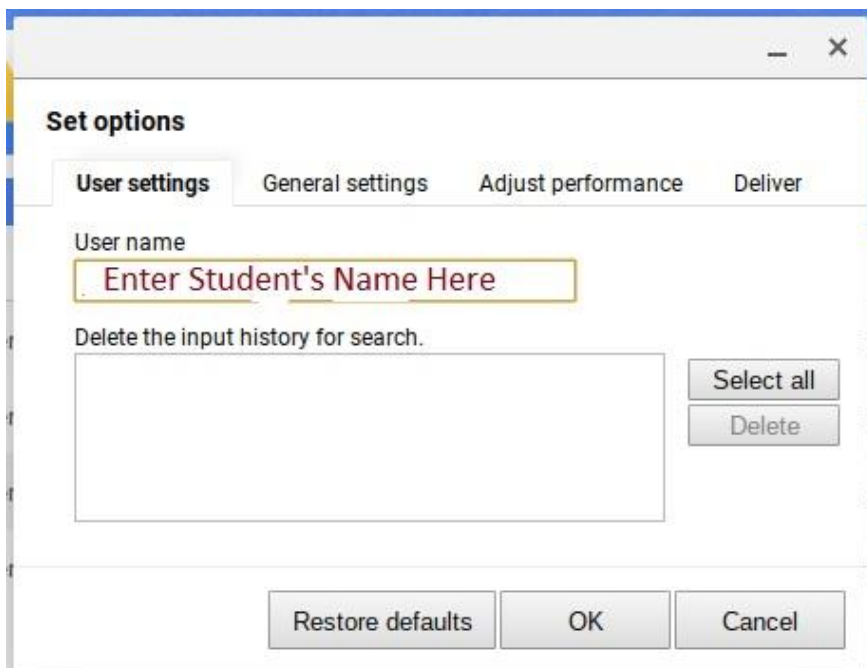
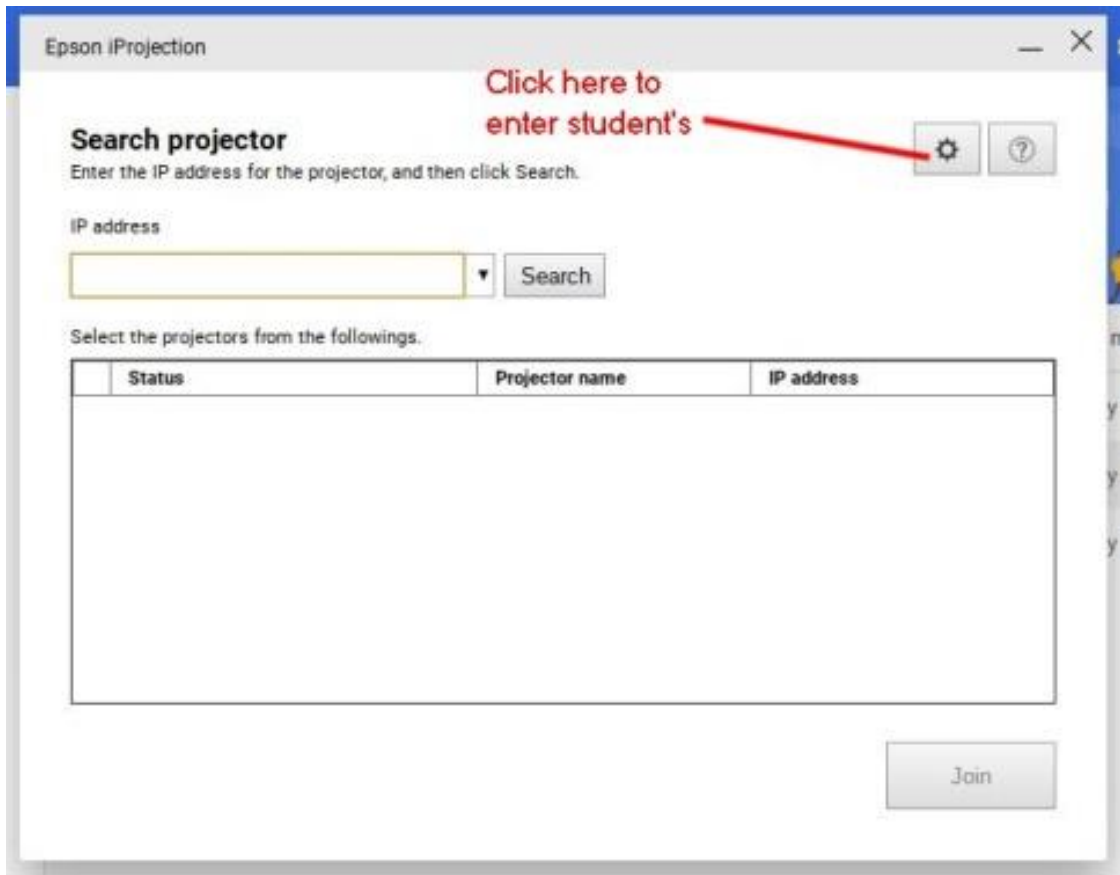

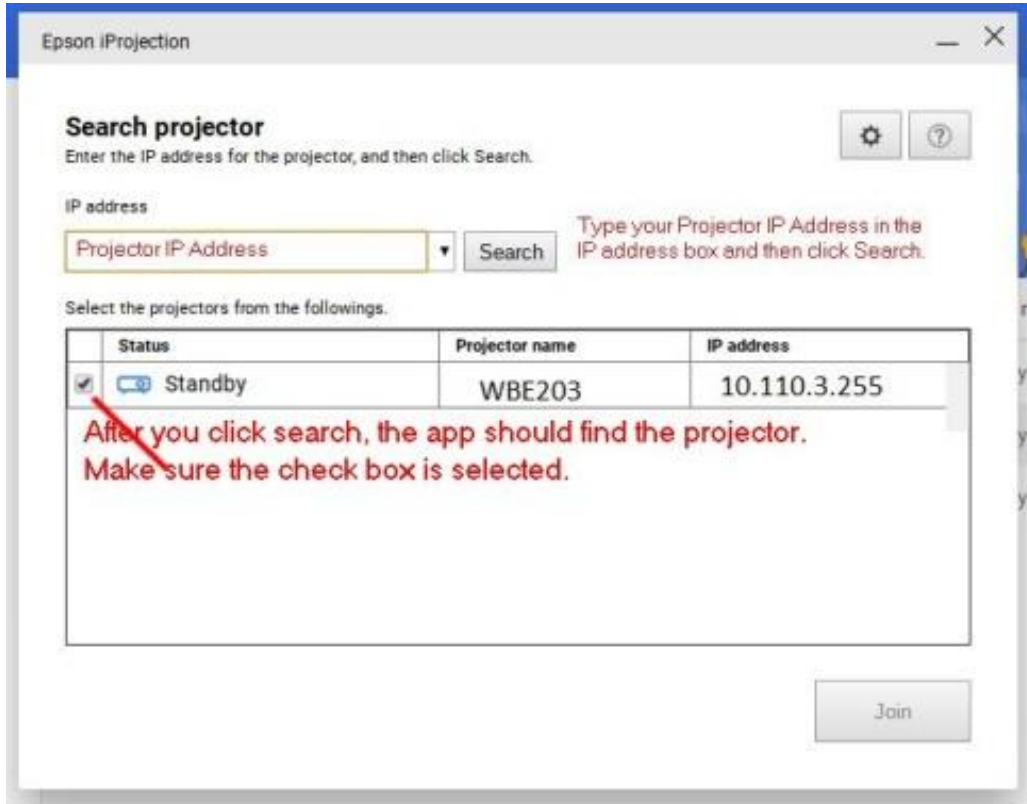
Select the projectors from the followings.

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4. The Gear Button will allow the student to enter his/her name. If you do not wish to change the default login name, go to step 5.

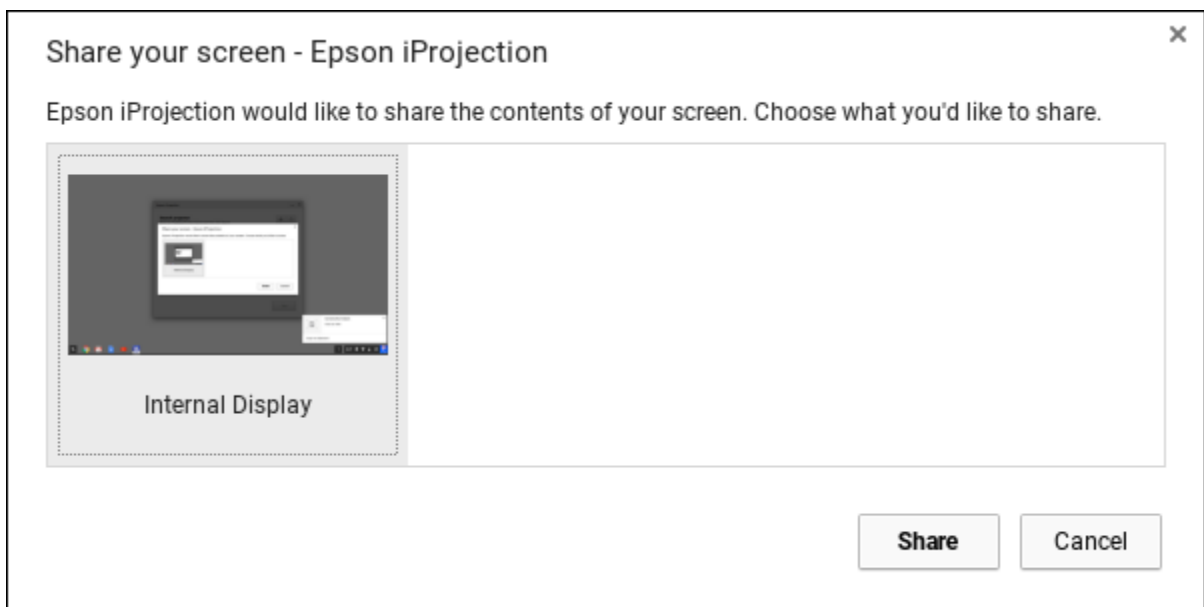


5. Enter the projector's IP address and click Search.



**After you click search, the software should find the projector. Make sure the check box is selected and click the Join button.**

6. You see this screen:



7. Click **Share**.

Your Chromebook's display is now mirrored by the projector. Anything that you do on your Chromebook is also shown by your projector.



When you're done, click the Epson iProjection icon in the Chrome OS app shelf, click **Leave**, and then click **Yes** to end the session and stop mirroring your Chromebook display.

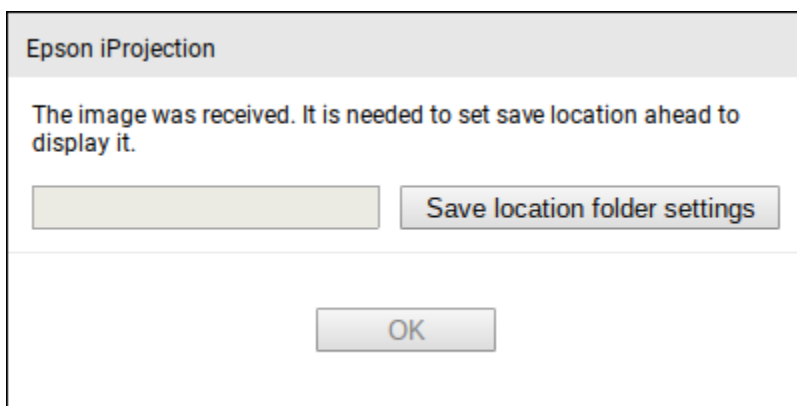
## Using Image Sharing

You can view images shared by the moderator.

**Note:** iProjection for Chromebook users cannot be the moderator.

1. From the moderator's device, share an image with all connected devices.

You see this screen on your Chromebook:

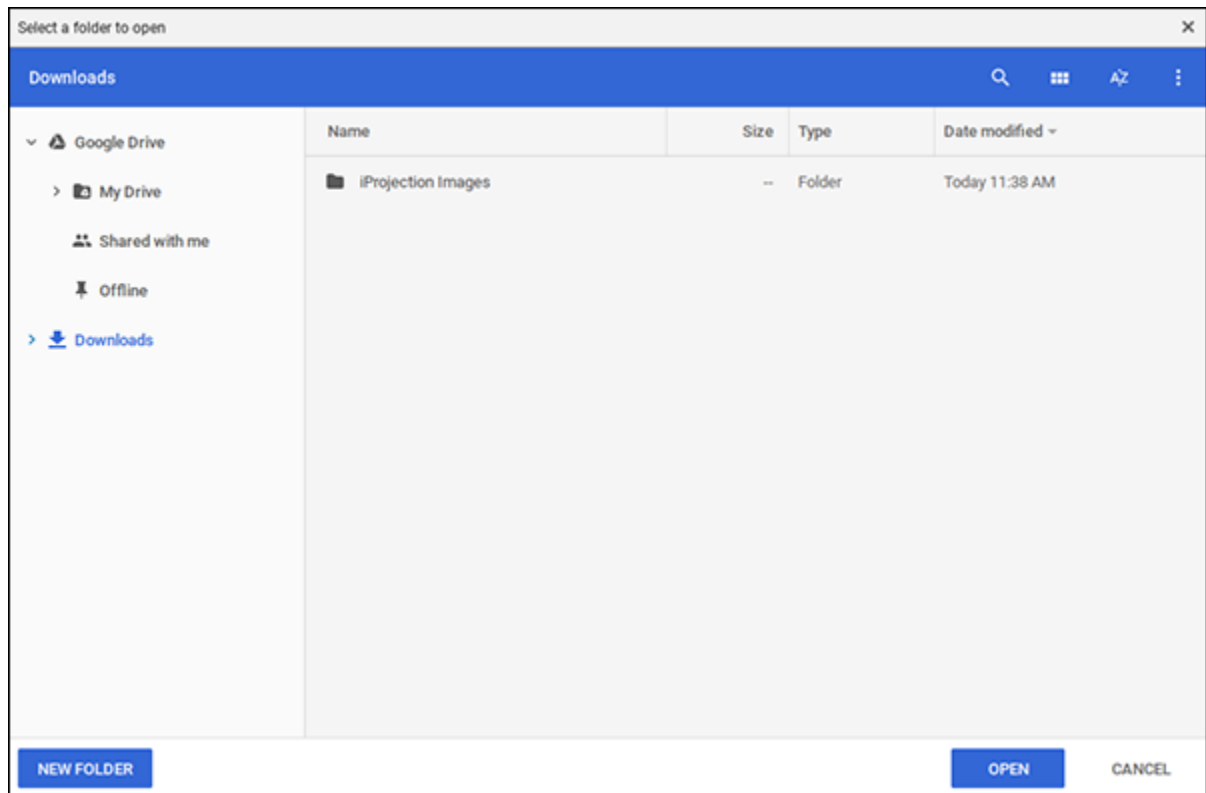


**Note:** If you don't see this screen, click the Epson iProjection icon in the

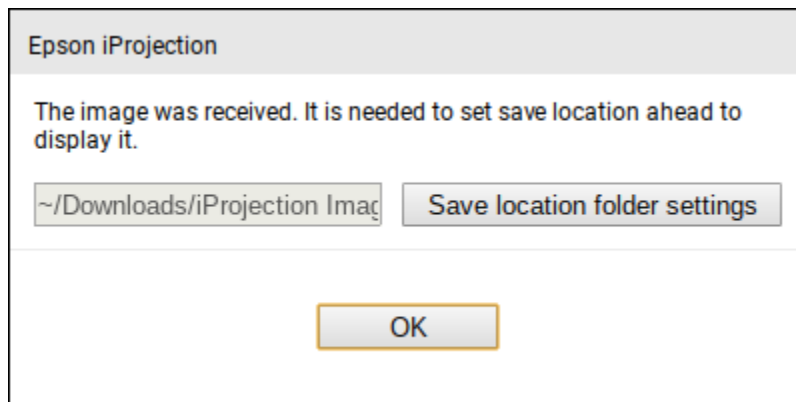
Chrome OS app shelf and click  **Display received images.**

2. Click **Save location folder settings.**

3. Select where you want to save any shared images, then click **Open.**



4. Click **OK.**




The shared image appears:







5. Click the left or right arrow buttons to browse shared images, or click  to open the annotation tools.



## Using the Annotation Tools

You can use the pen tool to annotate images shared by a moderator device.

1. Display a shared image from the moderator device.
2. Click  to open the annotation tools.
3. Use the following controls to annotate the shared image:
  - Click  to enable the pen tool and select the color and line width of the pen. Click and drag across the screen to annotate the image.
  - Click  to enable the eraser. Click and drag across the screen to erase any lines you have drawn.

- Click  to erase all annotations.
- Click  to save your current annotations to the folder you previously selected.
- Click  to switch projection to your device (not available when a moderator controls the projector).
- Click  to undo a previous annotation.

**Note:** You can undo up to 10 previous annotations.

- Click  to redo a previous annotation.
4. Click  to exit the annotation tools.
